On behalf of the Faculty of Humanities, Education and Social Sciences (FHSE), I would like to welcome you to the 18th annual IMISCOE conference. I regret that the conference cannot take place on our new campus in Esch-Belval, as the international environment you would have encountered here would have provided an ideal setting for this event. Located in the heart of Europe, the University of Luxembourg is a research university with a distinctly international, multilingual and interdisciplinary

character. With more than 6,700 enrolled students from 130 countries and about 1,600 academic staff from all over the world, it proves to be a transcultural melting pot, where research, teaching and learning is done in three official languages, and unofficially in many more. Topics such as multilingualism, interculturality, border studies and migration have thus also been almost 'natural' research foci of our faculty since the university was founded 18 years ago.

The Corona crisis, which has kept the world on tenterhooks for over a year now, has had a strong impact, especially on migrants. Borders were closed or more tightly controlled, racist prejudices gained political clout, and international solidarity - especially among EU member states - was severely tested. Luxembourg, which is more dependent on migration and cross-border cooperation than other countries, and its approximately daily 200,000 cross-border commuters were strongly affected by this change. The economic and political consequences of the temporary European sealing-off policy are hardly foreseeable so far in this country. At the same time, transnational movements and initiatives have formed during the worldwide pandemic that pursue political, social and scientific goals and are strongly supported by the idea of global solidarity.

Against this backdrop, a conference that is dedicated to researching the most diverse aspects of migration and that addresses issues of inequality, identity and diversity as well as the challenges of social systems such as politics, economy and education seems to me to be an important political signal. The FHSE is participating in this conference not only as an organizer, but also as an important player in cultural and social science migration research in Europe. Our faculty is home to the National Contact Point of the [European Migration Network \(EMN\)](#), the National Focal Point of the [European Agency for Fundamental Rights \(FRA\)](#) and the cross-border research network [UniGR-Center for Border Studies \(UniGR-CBS\)](#). Migration-related research is coordinated by the key research area „[Migration and Inclusive Societies](#)“ (MIS), which is dedicated to researching this complex topic area in 5 working groups.

The multitude of activities taking place at the FHSE in the field of migration documents the transdisciplinary nature of migration research in general, and that of the humanities and social sciences in Luxembourg in particular. Against this background, initiatives such as the IMISCOE conference can highlight the important role that a young, international university such as ours can play in a globalised science. I am therefore extremely pleased that this year we are able to welcome such a large number of internationally renowned and committed researchers from a wide range of academic and geographical backgrounds.

I wish you all a profitable and inspiring conference!

The trees are cultivated on the ecologically managed Finca Modelo, which has been awarded the [Bandera Azul](#), until they are planted and then released on our fincas in the La Gamba Biological Corridor and cared for for 3 years. 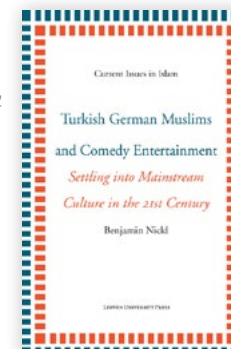

IMISCOE BLM-Statement

IMISCOE Statement on structural racism and racial justice in the context of Black Lives Matter

Migration scholars in the IMISCOE (International Migration, Integration and Social Cohesion in Europe) Research Network express our solidarity with the values espoused by the global movement against structural racism and racial injustice, not the least in the form of Black Lives Matter. We seize this moment to reflect further on ways in which we can strive towards racial justice and equality in our research and in our practices as a research community. We recognise that migration scholars have an important role to play in supporting racially discriminated scholars within our organisation, research and outreach activities. Towards this IMISCOE will:

-> Reflect:

- Facilitate IMISCOE's interdisciplinary researchers to strengthen their teaching, pedagogies, and curriculum content so as to enhance critical perspectives on racism, coloniality, and discrimination and how these intersect with gender and class and other intersectional insights.

Tomer Gardi, born in 1974 in Kibbutz Dan in Galilee, now lives in Berlin. He studied Hebrew Literature and Education in Jerusalem and Berlin and is, these days, finalizing his PhD in Hebrew Literature. Gardi's literary essay *Stone, Paper* was published in Hebrew in 2011 (German. 2013). In 2016, his debut novel *Broken German* was published by Droschl. He read an excerpt from it at the 40th Festival of German-Language Literature in Klagenfurt. The radio play for *Broken German* (SWR production, directed by Noam Brusilovsky) received the ARD German Radio Play Award in 2017. *Die Feuerbringer - Eine Schlager-Operetta* (WDR and BR co-production, director: Susanne Krings) was chosen by the jury of the German Academy of the Performing Arts as Radio Play of the Month for February 2018. Elif Shafak

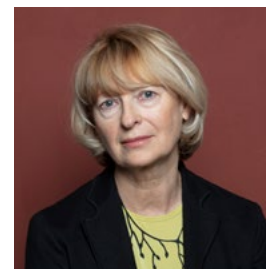

Her latest novel *10 Minutes 38 Seconds in this Strange World* was shortlisted for the Booker Prize and RSL Ondaatje Prize; and was Blackwell's Book of the Year. *The Forty Rules of Love* was chosen by BBC among the 100 Novels that Shaped Our World. *The Architect's Apprentice* was chosen for the Duchess of Cornwall's inaugural book club, The Reading Room. Shafak holds a PhD in political science and she has taught at various universities in Turkey, the US and the UK, including St Anne's College, Oxford University, where she is an honorary fellow. She also holds a Doctorate of Humane Letters from Bard College.



Shafak is a Fellow and a Vice President of the Royal Society of Literature. She was a member of Weforum Global Agenda Council on Creative Economy and a founding member of ECFR (European Council on Foreign Relations). An advocate for women's rights, LGBTQ+ rights and freedom of expression, Shafak is an inspiring public speaker

and twice TED Global speaker. Shafak contributes to major publications around the world and she was awarded the medal of Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres. In 2017 she was chosen by Politico as one of the twelve people "who will give you a much needed lift of the heart". Shafak has judged numerous literary prizes, including PEN Nabokov prize and she has chaired the Wellcome Prize.

Laurence Tellier-Loniewski is a French novelist, author of several novels published by Gallimard Editions, and a former lawyer registered with the Paris bar. For several years, she has volunteered in organisations helping refugees and asylum seekers. Her experience in an emergency accommodation center inspired her to write the novel „21 jours“ (21 days). Currently, she devotes herself to writing and volunteering.

Jean Portante

Jean Portante grew up as the son of Italian parents in Differdingen, a small town in Luxembourg. He studied Romance languages and literature in Nancy and was initially a secondary school teacher. In 1983, he settled in Paris as a freelance writer and has since lived alternately in Paris, Bruxelles, Havana and in Luxembourg. He is active as a writer, translator, editor, journalist, creative writing teacher and in publishing. Jean Portante produces programmes for Radio 100,7, was the founder of the Livres-Books supplement in 1996, and held senior editorial and directorial positions at the weekly *Le Jeudi* and *Éditions Phi* from 1997 to 2019. *Existential interspaces and borderlands, the search for orientation in the labyrinth of the world, the relationship between memory and forgetting, and the relationship to a literary language that is not one's mother tongue, represent central themes in Jean Portante's literary work.* One of Jean Portante's key works is his autobiographically influenced novel on migration and development *Mrs Haroy ou la Mémoire de la baleine*. It tells the story of the narrator's childhood in Luxembourg in the 1950s. Specifically it portrays identity conflicts between different cultural and linguistic worlds as well as the later reconstruction of biography and past through the writing process. The novel addresses the author's constitutive relationship between migration, uprooting, memory work and literature. The whale, as a marine mammal originally from the mainland, stands for the migrant's position between home country and country of arrival. In the further course of the literary work, the 'langue baleine', i.e. the Italian language that is always 'breathed' in Portante's French literary language as a result of the transplantation from the South to the North, becomes a central poetic metaphor of his writing. Jean Portante's works have been translated into numerous languages and have won many awards.

Screening of documentary & Q&A with Artist Stephen Copland

July 8, 2021 | 8h-9:30h

Documentary "Migration as Art Museum" with introduction and discussion with Australian-based artist Stephen Copland.

After decades of conducting international exhibitions and the workshop, Landscape of Heritage and speaking at conferences, Stephen Copland found a location in the village of Conzano, Italy in 2019. The town became famous for having been declared, in 1992, as the symbol of the massive emigration of the people to the northern Queensland, Australia, about 1890-1935. The ancient town square, named Piazza d'Armi (Weapons Square), was renamed Piazza Australia.

The Mayor of Conzano, Emanuele Demaria, and local artist Albina Dealessi assisted the artist to find a suitable building for the Museum given the Immigration context and Australian connections. The building was purchased and despite the pandemic, they are continuing our plan to establish the Museum and create heritage links with Ingham, Queensland and internationally.

The film Stephen Copland will present made by Italian filmmaker David Celoria visualizes the story of the journey.

Migration as Art Museum aim is to enhance social connectedness and foster connections, which develop links within new and existing global community members. In this way, it seeks to encourage personal understandings between new migrants, not so new migrants and members of mainstream communities internationally.

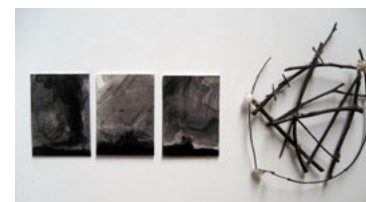

@ Virtual Exhibition Project by Uni Lu

The exhibition has been created by students of the Master in "Learning and Communication in Multilingual and Multicultural Contexts" at the University of Luxembourg. As part of a course on 'Creating and analysing visual data' we explored notions of home and how students, their family and friends relate to this concept visually. Our exhibition



on shows the complexity of what 'home' means to us and the people with whom we connect. It gives a glimpse of who we are ∞ multilingual and diverse ∞, but, more importantly, it tells stories about what we all have in common. Enjoy our exhibition! We hope you will feel 'at home'.

Multimedia Exhibition “ILOI”

IMISCOE and the University of Luxembourg are glad to be able to support this project.

Contemporary representation of Nigerian women in Italian mainstream media result, as is often the case with black women, in the reproduction of stereotypical images, such as those of human trafficking victims, sex workers, or madams (pimps). Unsurprisingly, knowledge over and perceptions of their lives on behalf of Italians, as well as Europeans, is often shaped by a criminal and victimizing narrative that is, in fact, far from being exclusive. The multimedia conceptual exhibition “ILOI” (“queen” from Edo language) aims to tell a different story, the story of a queen. By using conceptual art objects co-created with



the Nigerian women from Palermo, ILOI seeks to illustrate and question the complex relationship between researchers and respondents and challenge these contemporary representations. The exhibition thus takes shape in the form of a story about contradictions, layers, stereotypes and misunderstandings, but also the kind of joy, which only comes from knowing one another.

ILOI is the result of a collaborative model of exhibition making. It reflects the research and artistic journey of a PhD researcher Maria Shaidrova (University of Tilburg) and ten Nigerian women from Palermo as well as the work of the international artistic collective and nongovernmental organisations brought together by their attachment to this story. The different media, conceptual objects and interactive performances presented within the exhibition will encourage visitors to join the research and artistic journey of Maria and her friends, hoping to engender a new perspective on the life of the Nigerian community in Italy. What is tackled in ILOI, is the ways in which we look at one another and how these gazes may be questioned to engender new understandings.

Any qualitative inquiry in social research primarily reflects the interaction between respondents and a researcher. Yet, the knowledge (and art, in case of documentary photographers and filmmakers) that is being produced by these interactions is often silencing the researched communities.

In ILOI, we attempt to address this problem by adopting a so-called “collage methodology”. According to artist and a PhD researcher Kathleen Vaughan, a “collage methodology” represents both artistic pieces “whose piecing together creates resonances and connections that form the basis of discussion and learning” as well as an interdisciplinary methodology, “juxtaposing multiple fields of endeavor and situating the practitioner and his or her work within and between them”. Collage, a process of knitting together experiences, objects, history and future, reflects the complexity of human interactions and portrays them in a collaborative and truly “interactional” manner. By collaging, or merging, the perceptions of Maria, her friends and the team of art professionals, ILOI’s developmental process challenges positivist Western views of documentary photography and ethnographic writings by pointing to the possibility of interweaving academic and artistic endeavours. Thus, research participants represent themselves in the way they envisage such representations, instead of having the artistic team reproduce that “form of crisis chasing” which political anthropologist Cabot denounces for its “assuming that traumatic experiences ‘have to be studied’”. Connecting and investigating different modes of representation we came up with ILOI - both the ultimate finding of Maria’s research and the object of the research inquiry itself, a word, which asks more questions than it gives answers. These questions, about research and artistic positionality, feminism, victimization and postcolonialism, resonate within the exhibition’s nomadic travelling walls, following it and developing wherever it goes.

UNIC Semi-Plenary: Superdiversity and Inclusion in Higher Education

July 9, 2021 | 12h-13:30h



The UNIC Alliance of eight European universities (Erasmus University Rotterdam, Koc University, Ruhr University Bochum, University College Cork, University of Deusto, University of Liege, University of Oulu and University of Zagreb) based in post-industrial superdiverse cities was established with the primary mission to boost mobility and inclusion to achieve societal impact. Among the fundamental objectives of the UNIC Consortium, is to develop a structural platform for excellence on realizing inclusive universities, and a model of practice for transforming higher education in the superdiverse settings that define post-industrial cities.

The term superdiversity, coined by Steven Vertovec, has been subject to much debate concerning its scope and implications. While the term has been applied to describe diverse urban settings across the world, in the scholarly literature concerning higher education institutions in post-industrial cities, inclusion has been the favoured approach. In line with the UNIC Consortium's aims, this semi-plenary seeks to position the superdiversity debates in discussions on inclusion in higher education. The semi-plenary then brings to the fore key questions about the ways in which universities in super-diverse post-industrial cities engage with superdiversity in their institutional culture, organisation, teaching, research and student bodies. It raises questions about the implications of these for European higher education institutions and the superdiversity debates.

In parallel with the aims of the UNIC consortium, this semi-plenary seeks to explore the relevance of a superdiversity lens in the governance structures of higher education institutions which are already hosting students from superdiverse cities

Summary

Destination Europe is a learning and training tool based on role-play for 4-6 users. Over 90 min., players experience migration decision-making as a complex process that involves different actors with sometimes conflicting interests.

They consider various migration challenges first at the European Union level and then in their national and city contexts. The tool illustrates real-life impacts that policy decisions have on various categories of migrants and the public in the countries that receive them.

Why this learning and training tool about migration decision-making?

Migration is a highly politicised subject. The image of migration in public debates is not always well grounded in facts and can lack balanced representation of different points of view. This innovative learning and training tool helps students and professionals engage in more nuanced discussions about migration and integration challenges and opportunities.

What is *Destination Europe* about?

It is a discussion platform that helps users understand the complexities of migration decision making. They take up roles of different migration stakeholders and

immerse themselves in narratives about migration and integration at the level of the EU, their country, and their city. The stories are based on research and evidence. They illustrate potential outcomes of migration policy decisions for different groups of migrants such as refugees and asylum seekers, labour and irregular migrants and citizens of EU countries where immigrants settle.

Characteristics and practicalities

- Role-playing tool with game mechanisms designed for face-to-face interaction but also adaptable for online sessions
- 4-6 users
- 1.5 hours for a whole session, can also be split into 3 sessions of 45 min.

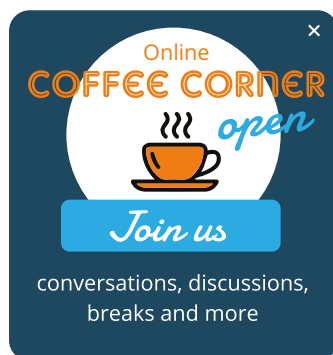
Maria Ioannis Baganha Dissertation Award 2021

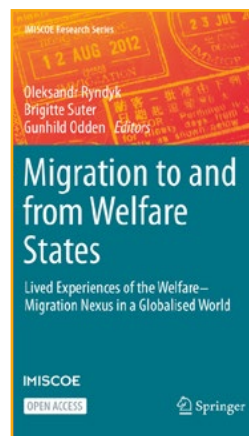
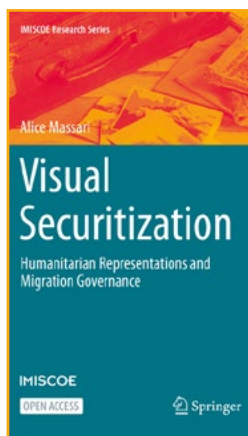
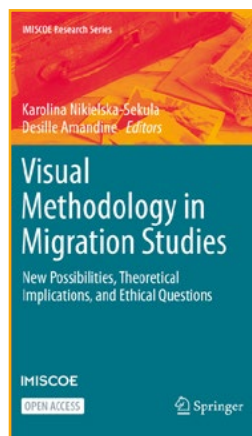


IMISCOE Publications - IMISCOE Research Series

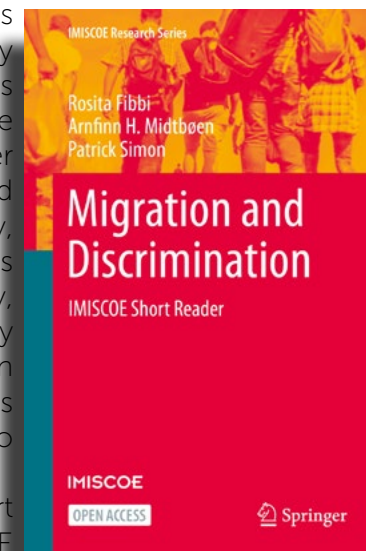

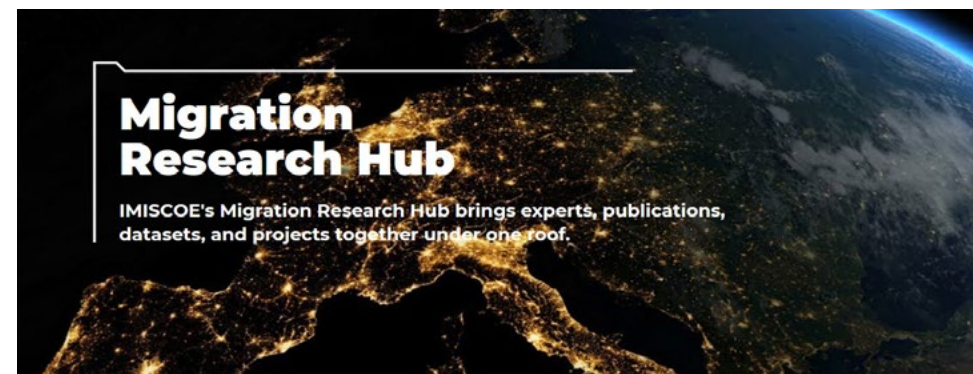

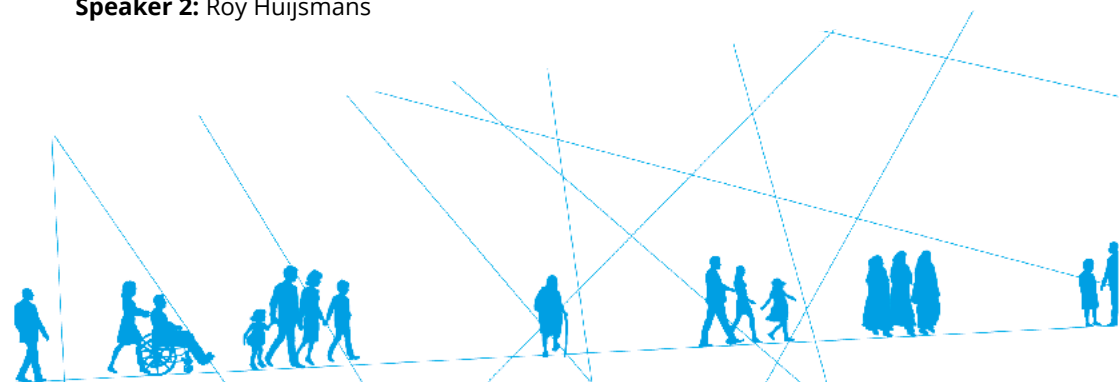

Research Database

The database forms the biggest part of the Hub. Over 100,000 items of research are indexed here, including journal articles, book chapters, reports, projects, datasets, and policy briefs.

Taxonomy of Migration Studies

Every item on the Hub is categorised into the taxonomy of migration studies. The taxonomy is divided into four branches: Topics, Disciplines, Methods, and Geographies.

The taxonomy topics were devised by a global and interdisciplinary team of thematic experts in [Migration Drivers](#), [Migration Forms](#), [Migration Infrastructures](#), [Migration Governance](#), and Migration Consequences, in consultation with the broader community.
